



TANGIHANGA GUIDELINES ALERT - LEVEL 2


UNDER ALERT - LEVEL 2, THERE ARE SOME RESTRICTIONS FOR TANGIHANGA.

Tangihanga can be held at a funeral home, at your whare, or at your marae (if marae is open).


To manage the risk of COVID19, there are key things that whānau, marae and hapū must ensure.



What to do if someone in your whānau passes away during Alert Level 2

If your loved one has recently passed away, here are some key tips to help you manage the health and safety requirements during tangihanga:



Kōrero with your immediate whānau about the tikanga you want to use to honour your loved one who has passed on

Do you want to have a tangihanga at the funeral home?

Do you want to take your loved one home to your whare?

Do you want to take your loved one to your marae?

How long do you want to hold the tangihanga?

Are you comfortable with holding a small tangihanga and asking some to wait for kawemate at a later date to pay their respects?



Select a kaimanaaki (support person)


Depending on your circumstances, you should consider selecting a kaimanaaki (support person) from your extended whānau or a close friend, to support you in organising the tangihanga. They will be responsible for ensuring the safety of everyone who attends, so you as whānau pani don't need to worry.



Inform the funeral director of your whānau wishes

The funeral director will be able to advise you and your kaimanaaki of what needs to be done to carry out your wishes.

They will be able to advise you on what to do and how to develop and manage a Contact Tracing form.



Kōrero to your marae committee

Some marae have decided not to open during Alert - Level 2. Others have agreed to open marae but have placed their own restrictions on tangihanga at marae. Kōrero to your marae committee to understand what is possible for you and your whānau to hold tangihanga at your marae.
